Tute student guidance: respectful conversations in our online classroom

Why this matters:

At Tute, your safety and wellbeing come first. Sometimes things happening in the world—like news stories or online discussions—can come up in lessons. Everyone should feel safe and included when sharing ideas.

This guidance is based on our SHINE values:

- Supportive We work and learn together.
- Honest We speak honestly and listen to each other.
- Inclusive We respect and include everyone.
- Nurturing We look after ourselves and each other.
- Engaged We are present, prepared and ready to learn.

What is not okay

In lessons, it is never okay to use language or make comments that:

- Hurts or excludes someone because of their race, religion, gender, disability, or background.
- Supports violence, hate, or extremist groups.
- Makes unfair generalisations (e.g., saying whole groups of people are 'all the same').
- Uses offensive jokes, slurs, or online symbols linked to hate.

What to do instead

- Think before you post or speak- will your comment make others feel unsafe?
- Share your ideas respectfully, even if you disagree.
- Listen carefully to others.
- Ask questions if you don't understand something learning is about curiosity, not judgement.
- Remember our SHINE values guide how we talk and learn together.
